To receive a designation of obtaining a real estate minor, the student must be admitted to the minor, and then complete and maintain a 2.0 or higher grade point average in the required courses. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS AND ADMISSION PROCEDURES

In order to apply for the Real Estate minor, students must be sophomores, juniors, or seniors who are in good standing at Virginia Tech with at least a 2.0 average in courses already completed in the minor.

Applicants should present the attached form and unofficial Virginia Tech transcript to the Academic Advisor for the Program in Real Estate, 430B Bishop-Favrao Hall. Decisions are made throughout the year and applicants should receive a response by email within seven to ten working days.

CERTIFICATION

In addition to fulfilling the requirements of their individual majors, students must complete the 18 semester hours listed on the attached sheet with at least a 2.0 average in these 18 semester hours. The minor will be noted on the student transcript.
